## CANADIAN BOATER EDUCATION CARDS REQUIRED AS OF 9/15/09

For United States citizens, however, these cards will **ONLY BE REQUIRED** if you are operating your powered boat in Canadian waters for more than 45 consecutive days, or, if the boat you are operating is registered or licensed in Canada. (This would include boats you charter or rent in Canada.)
